## ONLINE SAFETY

This week, some classes have talked about how to keep safe online and about bullying which can take place via social media, texts or messages. We are developing our curriculum to ensure that our children are given the knowledge and understanding to keep themselves safe online and what to do if they are worried.

As part of our commitment to Keeping our Children safe, we are using the National Online Safety website which also offers parents the opportunity to complete an Annual Certificate in Online Safety (105 minutes). There are 2 courses: one for 3 - 7 years and one for 8 - 11. They cover the following areas:
