KEEPING SAFE:

Like everyone, we are extremely pleased that the restrictions placed on us due to lockdown are easing now. However, this does mean that there is a greater chance of infections spreading if we are not mindful of our behaviour. This makes it even more important that we maintain the social distancing that we have at school. Families are gathering in significant numbers, particularly at the start of the school day. We ask that this does not happen. To try and reduce this, the gates will be open from 8.30am but children must line up and will be the responsibility of parents until 8.40am. - Don't block the gate during collection times


PARKING: Please do not block our neighbours' drives or park on double yellow lines. It is not safe for our children and is upsetting the community around us.
