



"Keep planting seeds, you never know what may take root..."


(Ecclesiastes 11:6)

Weekly Acts of Kindness


Reminding us of the work of the Mini Vinnies and the importance of kindness, we continue to share special 'Acts of Kindness' linked to the Gospel themes.








Different Ways to Pray









Our Saintly Stars

Our Team Saints Competition









Our Saint Team Captains








Our Saintly Helpers


Our EHC Mission Display



Advent in a Bag








The Chaplaincy Team gave each class in our academy trust an "Advent in a Bag". This contained a class liturgy for the 4 weeks of Advent.



Travelling Cribs










Advent Reconciliation Service




Carols by candlelight
