Yet, he still blessed the faithful who gathered on Easter Sunday at the Vatican City and St Peter's Square on Holy Sunday, he carried out God's work until the very end.

On Tuesday of this week, I delivered a reflection on the life of Pop Francis and a Celebration of the Word. The children were very reverent, and we learnt a lot about how the Pope cared deeply for the homeless, the lost and the marginalised in our world. Pope Francis' message was one of love and acceptance for all, something I know that at Endsleigh Holy Child we strive to demonstrate every day.

In memory of Pope Francis:

Pope Francis always advocated for the poor and the marginalised. He shunned any trappings of luxury or wealth. He wanted those on the outside of society to feel loved, to feel they belonged and to feel they had worth.

In 2015 Francis had St Peter's Square public bathrooms renovated with the inclusion of a barber shop for the homeless. They can shower there six days per week in a move Francis, 88, designed to elevate homeless people otherwise shunned because of their appearance and smell.

Perhaps his greatest gift was that of the Palazzo Migliori, a luxurious, 19th Century Vatican palace, just yards from St Peter's Square and with a balcony looking out onto the colonnade. It was previously occupied by nuns but when they left in 2019, many called for this prime piece of real estate to be turned into a grand hotel. Francis refused, and gave it to the homeless, believing that 'beauty heals'.

This lovely gesture, allowing the homeless in his city to be surrounded by physical and emotional beauty allows these people to feel valued and to be recognised for their human dignity – as we all deserve to feel. The loss of Pope Francis will be felt by many, Catholics and non-Catholics, who all saw him as a truly compassionate leader who carried out God's work here on earth.
