ASDA

Our school has registered with Asda's new extra 'cashpot' scheme for primary schools

Full instructions are on the web page above on how to link your current Asda cashpot app so that when you shop, both you and the school benefit each time you scan.

Please note that this does not affect your personal cashpot savings, it is extra free money for the school.

- Endsleigh will get £50 for the first person to sign up to support us. Please put the school's postcode (HU6 7TE) into the app otherwise it will go into a general national pot.
- Then for each person that selects Endsleigh as beneficiary, we will receive £1
- From there on and only up until 30/11/2024 at midnight you will get 0.5% of the total value of your shop donated to Endsleigh's savings (only 85 days left!)

After School Clubs

On Monday, we will be sending out a list of the after school clubs which you can then sign up for to begin on 16/9. We aim to offer a varied range of activities after school and look forward to seeing lots of pupils enjoying them.



We need the younger generation to become environmentalists, activists and scientists of the future with the ability to create new solutions to our pollution issues. SchoolCycled is aimed at educating and rewarding children for recycling plastic bottle tops brought in to school and deposited in collection boxes. As long as the bottle or lid is plastic, it can go in the SchoolCycled box to be recycled! The box is located in our school office foyer and anybody can place their bottle tops in. SchoolCycled will exchange our boxes for Earth Tokens – every kilogram of plastic bottle tops earns 250 tokens. These tokens can be used for furniture and play equipment, made from the plastic collected. Let's see how many boxes we can fill!
